

Oscar T. Bedrosian Memorial Scholarship

Through the support of family and friends of Dr. Oscar T. Bedrosian, The Learning Fund Foundation of School District 103 is pleased to continue our annual tradition of awarding a \$1,000 scholarship to an eligible high school senior who graduated from Lincolnshire-Prairie View School District 103 and plans to continue his or her education at a post-secondary school. The award must be used entirely for educational purposes.

Dr. Bedrosian served as the Superintendent of School District 103 from 1974-1993. He was well-respected and highly regarded throughout the community for his character and integrity, as well as for his many contributions to educational excellence. To honor the legacy of Dr. Bedrosian, the recipient of this scholarship will be selected on the basis of his or her integrity, ethics, character, and involvement and service in the community and school.

Qualifications:

Must be a graduating high school senior who graduated from Lincolnshire-Prairie View School District 103.

Applicants will be judged on the following criteria:

- 1) Integrity
- 2) Ethics and Character
- 3) Community and School Involvement and Service
- 4) Letter of recommendation from an adult (counselor, teacher, neighbor)

Emphasis will be placed on the concept of integrity as explained in question 6 of the application.

Application Process:

Applications must include an educational reference - a school counselor or other staff member who can verify the applicant's June 2016 graduation date and intent to enroll in a college or other post-secondary institution. Complete contact information for this reference must be included.

The award will be presented to the selected applicant at the Lincolnshire-Prairie View School District 103 eighth grade graduation ceremony. Applicants and their respective high school will be notified of the winner as soon as possible.
