

Dawn Anderson Scholarship Guidelines

Scholarship Eligibility:

Students must be graduating 8th grade from Daniel Wright Junior High School

Scholarship Amount:

\$2500 - \$500 awarded upon graduating from 8th grade and \$2,000 awarded upon graduating from high school.

Scholarship Application Guidelines:

- Applications are accepted online only.
- Each applicant will complete the application form, and two letters of recommendation (one from a teacher, one from a community member). Incomplete or falsified applications will be disqualified.
- Scholarship applicants may be asked to provide additional information.

Scholarship Notification:

- Scholarship recipient shall be notified after the Learning Fund Foundation (LFF) has given final approval of the scholarship award recipients.
- LFF shall provide the scholarship recipient with a letter notifying him/her of the grant. The letter shall inform the student that \$500 will be disbursed upon graduating 8th grade, and \$2,000 will be disbursed when LFF receives confirmation that the student is enrolled in a post-high school educational institution. The student will have to notify LFF what their post high school plans are by May 31st 2023. If LFF does not receive this notification by Dec 31st 2023, this money will be applied to future scholarships.
- The recipient shall be required to sign and return a copy of the letter indicating his/her acceptance of the scholarship.

Scholarship Record Keeping:

LFF shall keep records which shall include:

1. All information that the Foundation used to evaluate the qualification of potential scholarship recipient
2. The name, address, and other contact or identifying information for each scholarship recipient
3. A copy of the letter notifying the recipient of the scholarship grant
4. Follow up information obtained under section "Scholarship Investigation and Enforcement Procedures"

Scholarship Investigation and Enforcement Procedures:

LFF reserves the right to withdraw an offer of scholarship under various conditions including if a student engages in behavior that brings in question his or her honesty or moral character.
